



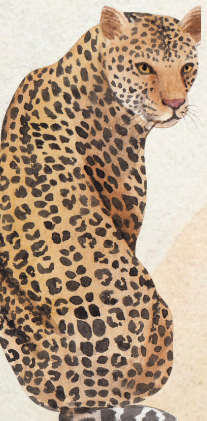

WHAT TO PACK

Packing for your trip to JAWAI, especially for a safari at KURJA Jawai, can feel overwhelming. To help you have a smooth and enjoyable experience, we've compiled a list of essentials to bring along. Here are some recommendations for what to pack:

SUMMER

For your safari at KURJA Jawai, it's recommended to wear neutral, earthy tones such as khaki, beige, and light brown. Avoid dark colors as they tend to absorb heat, and steer clear of bright colors since they can attract insects. Here are some key items to include: -

1. Long trousers, such as khakis, for the safari - Long sleeve cotton shirts, cotton t-shirts, or vests.
2. T-shirts for daytime.
3. Lightweight shorts.
4. Safari dresses or shorts for women (depending on the weather) - Light fleece or long-sleeved shirts.
5. Windbreaker or light jacket.
6. Swimsuit or bathing suit.
7. Comfortable walking shoes, track shoes, or hiking boots for walks - Flat, closed-toe shoes for camp.
8. Comfortable trousers for lounging around the camp.
9. Wide-brim hat, Panama hat, or safari hat.
10. Sunglasses and lip balm.
11. Mosquito repellent (though we provide repellent, you may prefer your own brand).
12. Camera, memory cards, and chargers.
13. Since our camps are in remote areas, bring extra correction glasses, contact lens solutions, spare contact lenses, and a sufficient supply of any prescription medication.

Sunscreen

We recommend bringing high SPF sunscreen to protect against the Indian sun.

WINTER

During the winter months (November to February), early mornings and evenings can be chilly. Pack accordingly with: -

1. Warm jacket or winter coat.
2. Warm hat, scarf, and gloves.
3. Long sleeve shirt with thermal undergarments.
4. Warm jumper.

Photographic Equipment

Photography is highly valued at KURJA Jawai, and we aim to help you capture stunning images during your safari. Bring your own camera and lenses if you are an avid photographer. Don't forget extra batteries and a charger. Note that drones are strictly prohibited.

Weather on Safari

Weather can be unpredictable, but the seasons generally follow a reliable pattern. Layers are key to staying comfortable. January is often the coldest month in Rajasthan, with mild, warm days and cold mornings and nights. Expect bright blue skies and sunny days with cool evenings, though occasional winds may stir up dust, so consider bringing eye drops. By following these packing tips, you'll be well-prepared for your adventure at Kurja Jawai.
