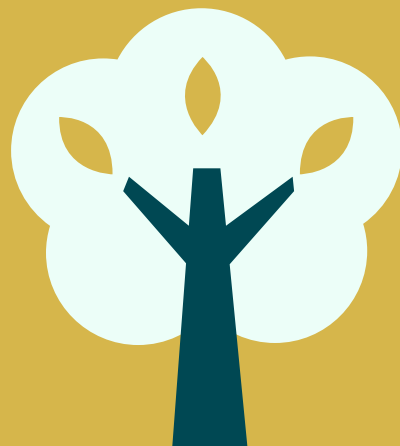

### About the Goal

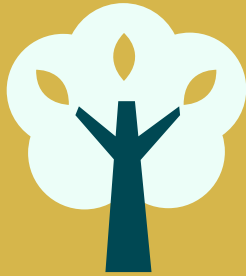
SDG 12 promotes sustainable consumption and production patterns, with a strong focus on waste reduction and resource efficiency.

## SDG 15 – Life on Land (Biodiversity)



### About the Goal

SDG 15 focuses on protecting, restoring, and promoting the sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems and biodiversity.

Located in a forest-adjacent and ecologically sensitive landscape, biodiversity conservation is integral to our identity and operations. Our resort has a direct role in protecting native species and supporting healthy ecosystems.

Hospitality operations significantly influence resource use and waste generation. Responsible consumption is therefore central to reducing our environmental footprint and promoting sustainable tourism.

This approach allows us to continuously improve our practices and demonstrate the impact of our sustainability initiatives over time.

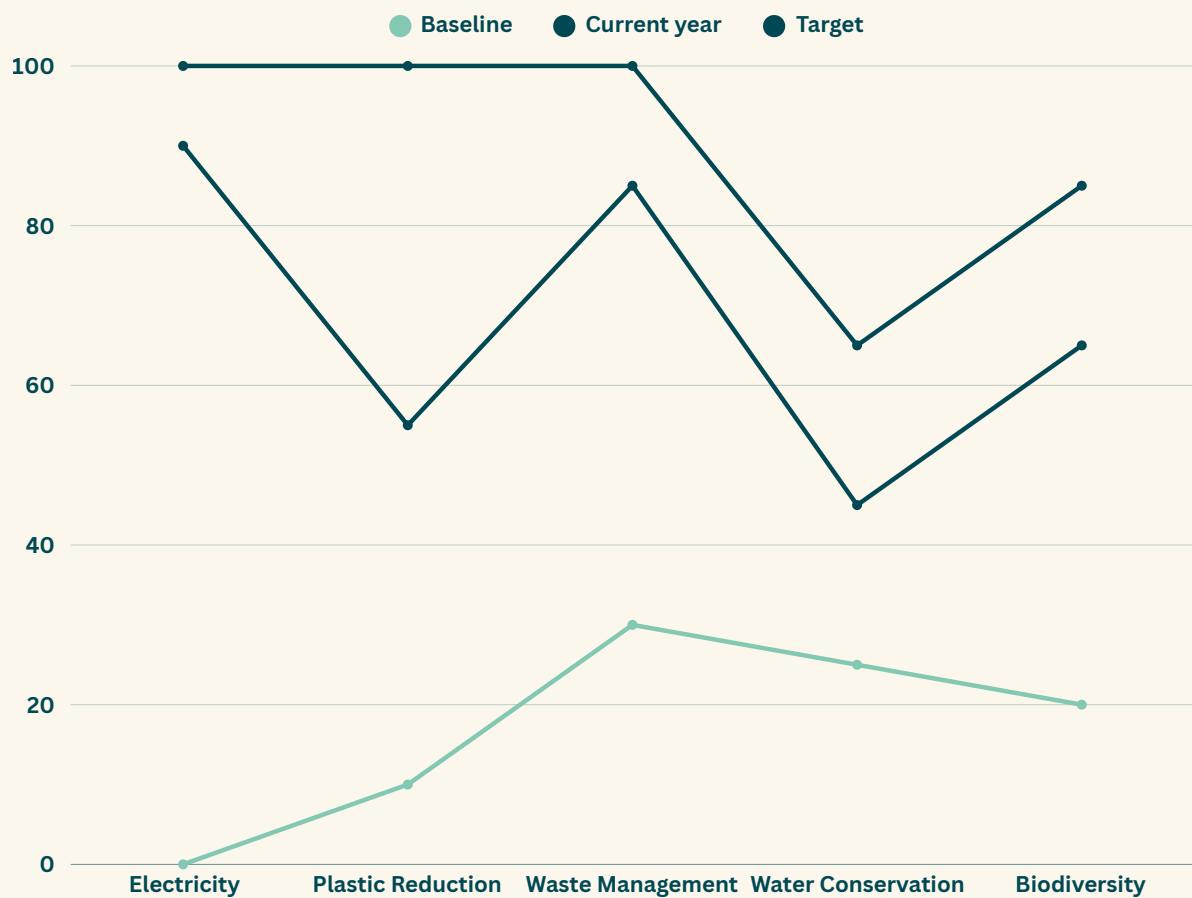
## Performance goals and how to get there

The following section highlights key sustainability activities undertaken across our resort operations. These initiatives reflect our efforts to reduce environmental impact, promote responsible resource use, and conserve local biodiversity. The table below summarises our core activities, the programmes implemented, and the outcomes achieved through these actions.

Key Indicator	Programs	Outcome
Electricity Use	Earth Hour participation, installation of motion sensors and energy-efficient appliances	Reduced electricity consumption; increased awareness among staff and guests
Biodiversity	Protection and maintenance of conserved tree patches within the resort premises, designated as biodiversity core zones	Enhanced habitat quality; increased presence of local and migratory bird species; improved ecosystem health; contribution to natural carbon sequestration and climate regulation
Guest Awareness	Eco-friendly signage and sustainability workshops	High guest participation; improved feedback on sustainable practices
Plastic Reduction	Plastic-free zones, elimination of single-use plastics	Total plastic saved annually; guests actively participate in responsible usage

# What Our Sustainability Progress Numbers Mean

## Renewable Electricity Usage

0 → 90 → 100

- Started with no renewable energy
- Currently 90% of electricity comes from renewable sources (solar etc.)
- Goal is 100% renewable electricity

## Biodiversity Enhancement

20 → 65 → 80

- Degraded/low-diversity baseline
- Significant improvement via native plantation & protection
- Target set at 80%, not 100%, to avoid over-claiming ecological control

## Waste Management Efficiency

30 → 85 → 100

- Basic segregation earlier
- Now 85% of waste is composted, recycled, or reused
- Target is zero waste to landfill

In 2025 alone, we recycled over 18 tonnes of organic waste into natural manure through on-site composting — turning waste into nourishment for our land.

## Water Conservation Measures

25 → 45 → 65

- Limited water-saving measures earlier
- Moderate improvement through fixtures, monitoring, reuse
- Target is 65% efficiency, respecting ecological limits

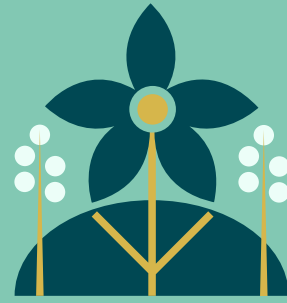
## Plastic Reduction

10 → 55 → 100

- Initially only 10% plastic reduction
- Now more than half of plastic usage eliminated
- Target is plastic-free operations

By sourcing milk directly from our in-house cows, we have avoided the use of over 80,000 plastic milk bags since 2014 — preventing more than 400 kg of plastic waste and supporting a truly circular, farm-to-table system.

# Next Steps



Sustainability at our resort is an ongoing journey. Our next steps focus on improving monitoring, setting clear performance targets, enhancing nature-positive practices, and engaging staff and guests. By aligning with national priorities and the SDGs, we aim to continuously increase our positive environmental and social impact.

## ZERO LANDFILL WASTE

- Description: Segregate, compost, and recycle to achieve zero landfill waste.
- Rationale: Minimizes pollution and promotes resource reuse.
- Intended Impact: Cleaner environment, lower carbon footprint, and engaged guests and staff.

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & CSR

- Goal: Support local communities through programs and partnerships.
- Impact: Stronger local livelihoods and social wellbeing.

## AWARENESS & EDUCATION

- Goal: Promote sustainability awareness among guests and staff.
- Impact: Informed participation in eco-friendly practices and long-term behavioral change.





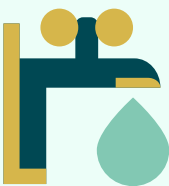
# Conclusion
