
### ROYAL HERITAGE & HILLTOP VIEWS

#### Fateh Vilas, Udaipur



Tucked away in the lush jungle near the Aravalli Hills overlooking the stunning views of Lake Pichola, Fateh Vilas captures the palace legacy of Rajasthan with vast, sun-drenched courtyards and terraces. The rooms are genuinely opulent, spanning a magnanimous 700 sq. ft. The suite at Fateh Vilas Suite comes with its own private plunge pool—a real treat for a private afternoon soak. Culinary offerings shine through multi-cuisine dining in both elegant indoor and alfresco settings, featuring authentic Rajasthani flavours. It's close enough to the city for a quick visit to the City Palace, yet feels entirely secluded. Rooted in Mewar's storied legacy, this property makes every stay feel like a truly regal experience, perfect for a sophisticated three-day break.

## Fateh Garh, Udaipur



Perched on a hilltop, Fateh Garh was constructed according to Vastu Shastra principles to ensure a sense of harmony and balance. The Heritage Chambers and Plunge Pool Suites are designed with traditional motifs and offer panoramic balconies with views of the City Palace and Monsoon Palace. The property feels like a living museum, housing a remarkable collection of vintage cars and offering activities like archery and zip-lining. The Baradari restaurant serves authentic Mewari cuisine, providing a "farm-to-fork" experience with local ingredients. It is a grand, hillside sanctuary that offers a different perspective on Udaipur, making it an ideal choice for a culturally rich and visually stunning staycation.
